1898 Brooms celebrate their centenary

this year. During the past 100 years enormous changes have taken place in the world at large and in the boating industry in particular. Those changes are reflected in the progress of Brooms.

It started with building and maintaining traditional wooden craft used by the local gentry on the Norfolk Broads. Then came the development of timber built motor cruisers for hire to the working population of the UK as paid holidays became the norm. Proudly, Brooms pioneered the development of fibreglass for boat construction through their Aquafibre Company started in 1965 - and now they build some of the finest seagoing cruisers in Europe

During the 1890's Mr Charles I Broom was running a small boatyard on the site at Brundall as one of four Broads yards owned by a company called the Norfolk

Broads Yachting Company. In 1898 the company sold the sites to the managers and so Brooms was born.

Charles Broom had three sons and three daughters. The three sons worked at the boatyard. The eldest son Charles died at a young age in 1936 leaving the developing business in the hands of Bernard (always known as Barney) and Basil Broom.

They survived the rigours of the Second World War by working for the British Admiralty building hundreds of wooden lifeboats and harbour launches.

In the late forties Barney's son 'Young Barney' joined his

Father and Uncle and then in 1958 Martin Broom, Basil's son, started with the company. In the sixties 'Young Barney' decided to take up the calling of the Church and was for a time the Curate of Brundall. He sold his interest in Brooms to Martin, who together

with his wife Jennifer, have developed and built the business to its present level, with further plans for growth already in place for the start of the next 100 years.

"MOTOR CRUISER OF THE YEAR"

Brooms received an enormous compliment and recognition of their craftsmanship at the prestigious British Nautical Awards Ceremony. Held in London during October 1997 in the presence of her Royal Highness, the Princess Royal, the Ocean 38 was pronounced "Motor Cruiser of the Year".

Martin and Jennifer Broom were guests at the Ceremony, knowing only that the 38 had been short listed. It was very exciting for them to hear the results announced, and for Martin to be called up to receive the award.

The citation read out with the announcement of the winner stated:

"The Broom Ocean 38. Launched at the London International Boat Show in January this latest addition to the Broom range was designed to fill the gap between their seagoing Offshore boats and the existing Ocean models for slower cruising. The Ocean 38 has a hull and level of performance equally at home on inland water, where over half of the boating in this country takes place, and the open sea. She provides fast seagoing passage making with comfortable cruising requirements, coupled with sound build and excellent finish, she is without doubt a winner."

EUROPEAN RECREATION CRAFT DIRECTIVE

June 1998 is the deadline set for all boats over 6 metres in length, offered for sale in Europe, to conform to the Directive. This ensures each boat is built to one assured standard and that the company building the craft is competent to maintain these standards. The boat then has to carry a CE mark as proof.

Brooms are pleased to announce that all boats leaving their works from September 1997 onwards already conform.

This huge undertaking was carried out by Brooms new Technical Manager, Frederick Dale. This position was specially

created to ensure all Broom boats would conform and having achieved this ahead of time, Frederick has now been put in charge of mechanical and electrical installations in all new boats.

To cope with Brooms expanding maintenance and service division,

1997 saw the completion

of the new Service Centre building. Designed to accommodate boats up to 50ft (15 metres) in length, each with its own individual bay, this new facility provides for very efficient handling and work areas.

Already the Centre has tackled a wide variety of jobs from virtual re-builds after accidents to complete refurbishment and straight forward annual maintenance requirements.

Also alongside the Centre is the now completed new Engineers Shop, fitted out to cope with all kinds of marine engine repairs and maintenance.

To make way for more service berths adjacent to these new facilities, some of the old timber boat sheds are being demolished and additional moorings created in their place.

BOAT SAFETY S C H E M E

For those who enjoy their boating on the inland Waterways of the United Kingdom, you will know that motor cruisers are now required to conform to the Boat Safety Scheme as laid down by the Environment Agency and the British Waterways Board. The Broads Authority are proposing a similar scheme to come into force in the year 2000 but recommends it as a Code of Practice from 1998.

During 1997 new boats from Brooms, when known to be destined for these areas, were provided with a Boat Safety Certificate. However, new boats having the new C E markings should be accepted as having a Boat Safety Certificate.

For owners of existing boats who want to upgrade their craft to have a Boat Safety Certificate, it's reassuring to know that Brooms are specialising in this work and will be pleased to inspect your boat and quote for the necessary work to be carried out at Brundall.

For those owners who only use their boats at sea, Brooms recommend the scheme as an added safety measure and it can also help with the sale of a vessel.

END OF AN ERA

For nearly a hundred years, traditional craft have been hauled out and launched at Brooms using timber 'ways' and boards coated in grease to slide the craft over.

In the early days a hand winch operated by two men was used but more recently a Marshall single cylinder diesel tractor equipped with a winch has hauled out and launched hundreds of boats up the "slipways" into timber buildings built in the 1920's and 30's.

This task is now done using a mobile hydraulic boat lift and the old buildings are being demolished to make way for more service areas. The tractor, originally purchased for £100, is still used to tow heavy loads around the premises!

To mark their centenary Brooms are proving their commitment to the future by building their biggest boat yet. A 50 footer of majestic proportions, this new design incorporates all those years of experience and knowledge acquired from building serious cruising boats for the most discerning owners.

The hull is designed by John Bennett with whom Brooms have been associated for nearly 30 years. This continued co-operation ensures the '50' will have the finest seagoing qualities. To guarantee that the latest styling features are incorporated into the overall design, Design Solution Associates are advising on both the interior and exterior detailing.

An aft cabin boat in the finest Broom tradition, the '50'has a choice of deck layouts. For starters there is a hardtop for the command position and this can have an electrically operated sunroof. However if preferred, an open steering position with an easy to fit hood, attached to the radar arch, is available.

A further choice is offered with the aft deck seating and access. One option is to have the seating incorporated in the dodgers to maximise the deck area as the Broom 41. The alternative has the side decks running right round the boat, including across the transom, and the seating set inboard to form an enclosed cockpit configuration. This makes the boat easy to work when mooring and also allows the aft deck area to become a virtual sun lounge with the hood neatly fitting round the set in coamings.



NEW 34-SEDANE

Brooms are pleased to introduce another addition to their Coastal Range.

- but this one is intriguingly different.

Whilst Brooms are well known throughout Europe for their fine aft cabin cruisers, the 34 Sedan has an open cockpit. Naturally it's built to the same high standards. However the 34 Sedan offers a completely different configuration. There is less sleeping cabin space, but much more room for day use.

The aft cockpit is easy to enter via the bathing platform which leads into the spacious deck saloon. The side decks are wide and easily accessible, making the Sedan an easy and safe boat to handle. The accommodation provides for a comfortable dinette opposite the galley, or a twin bunk cabin.

The 34 Sedan is a medium powered semi-displacement cruiser designed to cruise the Inland Waterways of Europe, but with the capability to go Coastal cruising.






