NEW FOR 2000

Brooms celebrate the new millennium by launching two impressive new models, the Broom 415os and the 42cl.

Whilst similar in size, they are quite different and offer, in their design, the subtle but important difference in the Broom Offshore and Coastal models.

Following the well proven and continually developed Broom 37 and 39 models, the 4150s has a planing "V" hull for fast offshore cruising. The deep draught and relative high hull sides give excellent sea-going qualities. The aft deck layout is a further refinement of the earlier Broom models by using the full width of the deck, with seats set in the dodgers.

The 42cl, whilst having a similar interior layout and same quality finish, has been developed as a progression from the award winning Ocean 38cl. The semi-displacement hull retains the keel that gives excellent handling qualities, whether in a rough following sea or navigating the confined coastal and inland waterways of Europe, which the draught of 3' 8" permits the 42cl to achieve. With cruising speeds well in excess of 20 knots with suitable engines, the 42cl is aimed at the serious yachtsman who wants to maximise his cruising potential.

Also taken from the 38 is the aft deck layout, which provides a generous seating area within the coaming. The side deck runs right round the boat

The new Millennium sees Brooms two years into the start of their second hundred years of continuous service to the boat owner. But how it's changed since the start in 1898.

The picture taken at Brooms fuelling jetty in 1999 captures some of the history. Preparing for engine trials is a Broom 50 os, whilst taking on water are two Wherry yachts. A true Norfolk Wherry, the black hulled one, has been a visitor to Brooms for most of the last century. Built for the famous 'Colmans' Mustard family of Norwich, "Hathor" was used by two sisters for many years and frequently seen at Brooms for mooring and service. In those days, she had a Skipper and a Cook as permanent crew. Brooms themselves owned and hired out a Wherry called the "Surprise" in the early days when they were starting to build up the Broom hire fleet which now consists of over forty luxury motor cruisers.



Service Centre

Since opening the new Service Centre in 1998, Brooms have carried out an increasing amount of repair and maintenance work to a wide variety of craft.

Boats up to 50 feet in length can now be handled ashore and worked on under cover in the Service Centre, which has excellent lighting and modern facilities.





The picture illustrates the variety of craft worked on. One is a Broom 44 being prepared for sale, whilst the timber vessel was in for a complete overhaul. This craft, "Katinka", is an Admiral class timber vessel built by Brooms in the early Sixties and moored and maintained by Brooms ever since. The boat is actually still owned by the same family. This long association between

Brooms and boat owning families is not unusual.

"Katinka" has a varnished hull and she is kept in one of the company's boathouses. Her hull has never been scraped until last year when all the varnish was removed and replaced. She now looks like new again, and if properly maintained will go on for another fifty years.

STAINLESS STEEL



The carefully shaped, substantial stainless steel stanchions and guardrails fitted round Broom built boats are crafted by the in-house team of skilled fabricators and are tailor made for each design.

This skill and experience is available to the Service Centre where all kinds of fabrication are available for the repair and refurbishment of boats which are worked on under excellent conditions.

In addition to this facility, Brooms also have a resident electronics engineer to supply and fit the latest navigation equipment.

Brooms are continuing to develop and extend their facilities for dealing with used boats on behalf of owners.

Whilst most of the craft offered for sale are Broom and Oceans, other quality motor cruisers are also handled. In the case of the Broom built boats, the great advantage is that the complete history of each boat is

available to purchasers, going back to the date the boat was built and first left the factory.

There is always a good selection of quality craft to view on the dedicated sales pontoons as well as the opportunity to look round the production areas. A further advantage of purchasing a used boat from Brooms is that any refurbishment or additional equipment required can be dealt

with in the Broom Service Centre before the boat leaves the works. For those new owners who would like to stay for a time at Brundall, moorings are available in the Marina.

The Picnic

One of the attractive features of buying a Broom boat is the opportunity to have the owner's hand over and delivery trials direct from the factory where the boat is built. Each boat is finally finished and prepared in a covered wet dock and is kent snotlessly clean until the owner's arrival.

The hand over usually takes a day or more with a cruise down the River Yare to Great Yarmouth, passing through the interesting harbour area to the sea for a test run along the coast to Lowestoft before returning back to Brundall. Time is then spent with the owner explaining the operation and location of every piece of equipment.



Any adjustments or additional requirements are then dealt with by the craftsmen who constructed the boat before she is ready to leave for her home port, either by sea or road transport.

Part of this Broom tradition is a Champagne picnic lunch organised by Mrs Jennifer Broom, who is a qualified caterer.
