Dear South Coast Region members,

What has happened in the Region since the last Newsletter?

• On Monday, 3rd April, members from the South Coast, South West and Thames Regions held a Zoom Technical Question & Answer session. This was led by the BOC's Vice Chairman & Technical Co-ordinator, Keith Rowe together with Tom Brissenden, long standing former employee of Broom Boats. I'm very grateful to Keith and Tom for giving up their time to lead this session which was attended by 17 members from across the three regions. Questions were wide ranging including: problems with toilet flush water backup; difficulties is starting a Perkins Sabre engine; and advice needed about a hot water calorifier. Those present agreed to have the Zoom meeting recorded and a copy was sent to those members who were unable to attend but were interested to find out "what went on". Another such meeting may well be held in the Autumn, if there is enough interest.

What other events are planned for the 2023 season?

- Tuesday, 25th April, I had hoped to arrange a Zoom meeting led by Magali Hamon from Port Chantereyne, Cherbourg to give details about the procedures for entering Normandy by boat in 2023. Unfortunately, I did not receive any contact from Magali and therefore, the session did not take place, which was a great shame.
- Friday 12th Sunday 14th May: Rally at Haslar Marina, Portsmouth organised by members Beverly & Martin Briggs. This is the first sea-going rally of the Region's season, and from the information that Beverley has sent out, it is clear that this

event is proving very popular. Approximately 18 boats are represented with about 39 members and friends planning to come by sea or car. The weekend will include: a pontoon party on Friday evening; an optional boat trip around Portsmouth Harbour on Saturday afternoon; and an evening meal at The Creek restaurant. Plus, one of Beverly and Martin's quizzes!

My thanks to Beverly and Martin for all their hard work in preparing for this event.

One of the main items on the Agenda was to receive the results of the April on-line Survey that had been set up to gauge members' views about various aspects of the BOC's activities and inform the work of the committee.
